

Frequently Asked Questions Related to COVID19 Pandemic

What happens if I register and become ill before the Weekend begins?

We encourage everyone who is ill to postpone attending the Weekend until their health is restored. Do not attend an in-person weekend if you are sick. You will have a better experience if you are not sick and you will prevent the spread of your illness to others by not attending. Registration fees are transferable to another Weekend. Communicate as early as possible if your illness will prevent you from attending.

What regulations are being followed to make Crucible Weekends safe?

We value your physical and emotional safety during all our experiences. We believe that being in integrity includes following government entity's regulations and laws. We will be compliant with governmental COVID19 regulations on our Weekends. We encourage you to check regulations of state and local guidelines at the Weekend retreat site location before registering for the Weekend.

What is your position on vaccinations, masks and social distancing?

We encourage everyone planning to be at our Weekend sites to be fully vaccinated prior to their arrival date. Federal public health authorities have stated that those who are fully vaccinated do not need to wear masks or physically distance. Federal public health authorities have also stated that unvaccinated people should continue to wear a mask and physically distance. We encourage all unvaccinated people to reconsider registering for the weekend or to wear a mask throughout the weekend if they choose to attend.

Will I need to be tested before attending the Weekend?

Unless governmental regulations require it, staff and participants are not asked to present COVID19 test results for participation on our Weekends. On our Weekend you will be in contact with others who may not be vaccinated and may not have been tested. Consider your personal health risk in deciding to register for a weekend.

Will I need to show proof of vaccination?

Unless governmental regulations require it, staff and participants are not asked to present proof of COVID19 vaccination. While we encourage vaccination, we will not ask you if you have been vaccinated.

Will I be able to physically distance during the weekend?

Except for where governmental regulations require it, social distancing will be difficult on our weekends. Sleeping accommodations, restrooms, dining and some Weekend experiences will put you in close proximity to others. Physical distancing will not be possible, unless public health guidance requires it on the Weekend site. As with any health matter, we will make reasonable accommodations if individually requested.

What are the reasons for not requiring vaccinations, masks and social distancing?

We believe that our personal power comes from the choices we make. We also believe each person is responsible for the consequence of their personal choices. We believe you are the best person to make your health decisions regarding registration and attendance. An abundance of publicly available COVID19 information and education is available to you as you make your registration decision.

What are the COVID19 requirements for attendance?

In addition to any governmental regulations, you will be required to sign a document waiving Crucible of liability for your personal health decisions to attend and participate in our Weekend. The document acknowledges that you know and accept COVID19 risks and will hold Crucible harmless of any related health outcomes of your decision to attend.

How can I talk to someone about more COVID19 details of the weekend I want to attend?

After you register, your Weekend Participant Coordinator will contact you by email. Questions specific to that Weekend can best be answered by your Weekend Participant Coordinator.
